Chaplain's Message Father Matt McCarthy

"Praying for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life can resemble much of what the Apostles experienced immediately prior to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Right before his Ascension, Jesus did not instruct them to start getting busy with the work of evangelization, but first...to wait, to watch, and to pray with Our Lady - all this for an undisclosed time. Eventually, when the time was right, they experienced an explosion of the love of God the Holy Spirit, and a superabundance of his gifts. But the requirement for such a blessed event was simple - to wait, pray, and trust.

It's perhaps when our prayers for vocations or for any other intention seem to go unheard, that we ought to look to the Apostles and Our Lady as models of perseverance and patience. The Lord has promised, through various saints, to bring about a new springtime of vocations. When will this happen? There are signs of it already beginning; but the fullness of it will only be experienced when God deems the time right. Until that time - we follow the model of the Apostles and our Lady in the days leading up to Pentecost: waiting, watching, and praying for an abundance of labourers for God's harvest."


Installation of New Members
